Program Description:

The program will be held in two locations. Tolon, Greece is where the first half of the program will take place. Tolon is located in the north-eastern corner of the Peloponnese, very near Nafplion, which was the first capital of the modern nation. Although Tolon has become more popular with tourists in recent years, it has retained most of its charm and all of its friendliness. Tolon is also located near important cultural sites such as Mycenae, Argos, Tyrins, Corinth, Epidauros and Olympia. The second half of the program will be spent in Athens, the birthplace and home of Socrates and Plato. Excursions to Delphi, the Acropolis, the ancient agora, and the National Archaeology Museum of Athens and many more are easily possible.

Program Focus:

Two to three courses from any academic field will be selected for the 2009 program. All courses must be related to either ancient or modern Greece.

One to two course proposals will be accepted in this program.
