Tolon, Greece is where the second half of the program will take place. Tolon is located in the north-eastern corner of the Peloponnese, very near Nafpliuon, which was the first capital of the modern nation. Although Tolon has become more popular with tourists in recent years, it has retained most of its charm and all of its friendliness. Tolon is also located near important cultural sites such as Mycenae, Argos, Tyrins, Corinth, Epidauros and Olympia.
