**COURSE DESCRIPTION** Advanced Portuguese II. Three credits. Prerequisite: PORT 3010 or permission of instructor. Advanced-level practice in language skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing, including review of Portuguese grammar. Continuation of Port 3010.

**Course Objectives:** The objective of this course is to continue developing proficiency in Portuguese in the four language skills: speaking, reading, listening, and writing. Specific goals are to develop students' skills in speaking and writing, using the present, past, and future tenses, and using vocabulary relating to the family, friends, life events, traveling, and life in Portuguese speaking countries. Students will develop skills to easily read newspapers and magazines, write letters, essays, and understand native Portuguese speakers.

### **Outline of Course Topics**

1. Review of all verb tenses
2. Vocabulary review
3. Clarification of present, past and future subjunctive
4. Passive voice
5. Personal Infinitive
6. Relative pronouns – introduction to new ones
7. Compound tenses
8. Ser/estar clarification
9. Regions in Brazil: North and Northeast – main cities, songs and culture
10. Intensive conversation
11. A good reading ability in Portuguese

*Instructional Activities:* Daily classes will be followed by organized outings or individual assignments (cultural observations/language practice).
