

Program Description for Prospective Faculty

Program: SPAIN

Approximate Program Dates: Three weeks in May / Three weeks in June or a combination of both programs for seven weeks from May – June (subject to change)

Program Focus:

The program in Spain will continue to offer Spanish language, literature and culture. All elementary and intermediate levels use a standard syllabus approved by TBR and a common textbook, Plazas, which is rented to the students on site. If you are applying to teach elementary or intermediate Spanish, you do not need to submit a syllabus. If you are applying to teach an upper division class, a complete syllabus is required.

In addition, courses taught in English from other academic fields are welcome as long as they relate closely to Spain.

Program Description:

The program will take place in Segovia, a charming, provincial capital in the foothills of the Guadarrama Mountains, only 60 miles to the north of Madrid. Segovia's location makes it ideal for excursions, and the pleasant weather and congeniality of the Spanish people lend a spirit of cordial hospitality. Segovia retains the strong, traditional Spanish character of Old Castile and has a visible history that goes back to pre-Roman times. In Segovia, students may explore the city's Roman and medieval past and venture into the surrounding areas of Old Castile.
