Program: GRAND EUROPEAN CAPITALS (GEC)

Approximate Program Dates: Three weeks in June. (Subject to change – final dates are set in August prior to the fall faculty orientation.)

Program Focus: This program is designed to provide students with a variety of courses while they experience important European Capitals: Berlin-Amsterdam-Paris (GEC). Course proposals are welcome from all academic fields, as long as they relate closely to the locations of the program.
